Manchester Artist Marks her Territory

Manchester based visual artist Anne-Elizabeth Orton will be presenting *Marking the Territory*; a new development in multimedia drawing at the MMU Link Gallery in April. Marking the Territory is a visual and audio installation which explores cities and the sounds and artefacts found within them by projecting video, photographic and hand drawn graphics with multiple digital and analogue projectors on to laser etched objects and walls. Traditional drawing methods are used to interact with the moving images, forming a live installation which illustrates human interaction with city spaces and questions issues around public ownership. She said "This is the first major public showing of the work since an event in Helsinki last October and I'm excited to be showing new developments in three dimensions. As so much of the work has been inspired by walking in the city of Manchester it's fantastic to have the opportunity to bring it home."

Local residents may recognise Annabeth (working under the name Glittermouse) for her other creative efforts as she has also become a regular feature at fairs and events in and around the Manchester area with her range of recycled crafts. Currently studying an MA in 3D Design at Manchester Metropolitan University, she has taught Art and Design at Further Education Colleges in London and Manchester since 2003.

Marking the Territory will be open from 09.30 – 16.30 on 14th, 15th and 16th of April for the drawing installation and all day on Monday 19th with a closing event from 17.00 – 19.00 including live audio mixing by Ne7. The Link Gallery is situated in the walkway between Grosvenor and Chatham buildings of the All Saints Campus on Oxford Road, Manchester. See www.glittermouse.co.uk for more details.
